



### FABRIC KIT DONATIONS

WELCA is collecting for Lutheran World Relief Fabric Kits during the months of September and October. Each fabric kit includes:

Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:

- 2 1/4 yards of 60" wide fabric, or
- 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or
- 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Two spools of matching general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Your donations of items from the list are welcome, as well as money with which to purchase items. Leave items in the credenza in the main hallway.

Duncan is the unlikeliest of pastors. Formerly incarcerated, he is now a black preacher in the ELCA. Part manifesto, part confession, and all love letter, *Dear Church* offers a bold new vision for the future of the ELCA and the broader mainline Christian community. It rejects the narrative of church decline and calls everyone - leaders and laity alike - to the front lines of the church's renewal through racial equality and justice.
